Creative Curriculum for Preschool

Creative Curriculum for Preschool is a comprehensive, research-based curriculum that features exploration and discovery as a way to learn.

Based on 5 fundamental principles:

1. Positive interactions and relationships
2. Social-emotional competence
3. Constructive, purposeful play
4. Quality learning environment
5. Teacher-family partnerships

Second Steps

Second Steps focuses on social-emotional skills, friendship skills, and problem solving. The curriculum also focuses on self-regulation and identifying feelings.

Talking About Touching

Talking About Touching is a curriculum that includes lessons for children on how to ask for help and how to protect themselves.

The Pyramid Model

The Early Childhood Pyramid Model provides a framework of evidence-based practices that promote young children's social emotional competence, and prevents and addresses challenging behaviors.

Teaching Strategies Gold

Teaching Strategies GOLD is an ongoing observation based assessment system to help educators gather information about each child's development. Children are assessed 3 times (Fall, Winter, and Spring) and results are shared following each report is completed.
